KanCare and Medicaid Basics



Public insurance coverage for low-income families and individuals.



Jointly funded by the federal government and the State.



Each state operates its own Medicaid program within federal guidelines.



KanCare Basics: Medicaid Agency Roles

KDHE

- Physical health care services
- 1115 Waiver
- Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS)
- Program integrity
- KanCare eligibility policy and the Clearinghouse
- MCO contract management and compliance

DCF

Foster care and adoption assistance youth

KDADS

- Behavioral health care services
- HCBS (1915(c)) waivers
- Nursing facilities
- State MH and I/DD Hospitals
- MCO contract management and compliance



KanCare Overview



KanCare Overview

Medicaid + Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) = KanCare

- 1. **Medicaid:** Health care program for people with very low incomes who also meet some other eligibility criteria: age, condition, disability.
- 2. Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP): Covers children in families with incomes too high to qualify for Medicaid. Benefits almost identical to Medicaid.
- 3. KanCare: The Medicaid and CHIP managed care program in Kansas.



KanCare Overview

KanCare was created in 2013 to:

- Provide better coordination of care.
- Improve health outcomes.
- Offer extra services (adult dental).

In 2019 KanCare was renewed and added:

- A pilot to support employment and independence.
- Expanded telehealth.
- Health home services.
- Supports for social determinants of health.
- Expanded access to SUD treatment services.



Current KanCare MCOs



Aetna Better Health® of Kansas





MCOs are responsible for:

- Coordinating care including visits to your primary care doctor, specialty care, nursing facility services, hospital stays, SUD treatment and home and community based services.
- Paying providers for health care services.
- Ensure quality of care.



Who KanCare Serves in 2023

- Whole-person integrated care to over 500,000 Kansans.
- Over 60% are children.
 - Children are about 25% of program costs.
- Approximately 25% are elderly and disabled.
 - Elderly and disabled are 60% of program costs.
- Seven Home and Community Based Services groups.
- People in nursing homes.
- Pregnant women, parents and people with behavioral health disorders.
- Individuals with breast and cervical cancer, HIV/AIDS.



KanCare in 2023

Extra KanCare Benefits

- Adult dental services and cleanings, dentures.
- Baby showers for pregnant women.
- OTC medication and supplies, farmer's market vouchers.
- Healthy Rewards gift cards, nutrition education home delivered meals.
- GED support, weight management support.
- Community Health Worker and doula pilot.
- Extra transportation services (WIC appts, employment).
- Pest control, internet access/devices for telehealth access, smart phones.

New MCO contracts go live

Bid proposals are due to the State

Spring 2024 – December 2024

Implementation, readiness reviews



CanCare Goals of the KanCare Bidding Process



- Improve program innovation, remove unnecessary restrictions.
- Address operational issues for healthcare providers.
- Fix current contract where it is difficult to enforce.
- Improve contract where it is too restrictive.
- Implement program priorities and input from the public and stakeholders.
