

Geo-Access Reporting Requirements

Updated November 2013

Member Data

Please ensure the plan uses the most recent member data available. For future deliverables, the plan should specify that “all members as of x date are included.” Please verify member data used for the reporting has been de-duplicated. Member data should be plotted using the member’s zip code. However, member access within the network adequacy report tables should be reported only at the county level.

The State requests the plans ensure their member data file used for each geo-access deliverable can be replicated (through use of version control), should it be necessary to revise any component of the deliverable to correct any issues that might be identified after State review.

Provider and Location Data

The following paragraphs address each of the individual reports submitted in the Geo Reporting and it is intended to clarify how providers and locations must be counted for each of these separate individual reports:

- **Maps by Specialties**

Please report unduplicated number of providers by unique provider ID, and specialty. Then de-duplicate by name of provider, so providers that have different NPIs are not double counted in the unique count of providers. Report number of locations by unique physical address, and specialty. For example, in the hypothetical case of Dr. X, who has 2 office locations in Dickinson County where he provides services, one location in Saline County, and another one in Riley County; the map will show 4 locations corresponding to Dr. X; and as number of providers, Dr. X will be counted once.

- **Summary Table Report of Specialties**
 - **Providers**

Please report the number of unique providers for each specialty, by unique NPI and specialty, and by name. For example, Dr. X will be counted once. Providers credentialed and providing services for more than one specialty should be counted as a provider under each active specialty.
 - **Locations**

Please report the number of unique locations by unique address where the services are rendered. In our example, we will include 4 locations corresponding to Dr. X offices where he provides services.

- **HCBS Report**

Please report the number of unique providers per county. In the case of Dr. X, he will be counted 3 times because he offers his services in 3 different counties: he will be counted once for each of the 3 counties in which he provides services.

Regarding this report, Geo Report Requirements for 2013, pages 7 and 8, it says:

“Home and Community Based Services Providers by County

For the provider types and services in the list below, the State has defined an access standard of at least two providers available to serve each of the 105 Kansas counties. The provider is not required to have a physical address/office located in the county, but must be available to provide services to members within the county. **HCBS providers must have the ability to provide services in the home.** “

This means that although the providers may not have a physical location within a county, as HCBS providers, they should be able to provide services in the members’ home.

- **Specialties with Access Standard (without map)**

Please report the number of unique providers by unique NPI and specialty per county. Again, as in the HCBS report, Dr. X will be counted 3 times, once for each of the 3 counties where he provides services.

- **NEMT Report**

Please report the number of unique providers by unique NPI per county. Again, as in the HCBS report and the report Specialties without maps, Dr. X will be counted 3 times, once for each of the 3 counties where he provides services.

- **Specialties Included in KanCare in 2014 (I/DD)**

This report will expand starting in January 2014. This report will mimic the requirements and format of the HCBS report. Please refer to the report template provided below in page 14.

Special emphasis is given to make an effort to keep a clean database so duplication of these two types is avoided.

Please specify in the report that “all providers as of x date are included.” The State requests the plans ensure the provider data file used for each geo-access deliverable can be replicated (through use of version control), should it be necessary to revise any

component of the deliverable to correct any issues that might be identified after State review.

All providers within the State and in Border States should be included up to 50 miles from the Kansas border, unless otherwise specified. A list of zip codes within the state of Kansas and within 50 miles of the border is provided with these instructions for your use in programming the report.

Please note that it is permissible to include telemedicine sites that are available within a provider site and used to provide access to specialty care, for the geo-access maps representing each specialty. However, in-home telemedicine services should not be included.

Formatting Requirements- Maps

- Consistent titles for maps. Please use the language in the “Provider/Service Type” column of the Kansas Geo-Access Standards table below for map titles
- Consistent font for headers and labels
 - Map Title: Arial
 - Provider Counts: Arial
 - Map Foot Notes: Arial
 - County Labels: 7 point Arial (please ensure county label text boxes don’t overlap one another on the maps)
- Consistent color scheme:
 - For illustrating urban/semi-urban access standards, use yellow (red=255, green=255, blue=0)
 - For illustrating densely-settled rural access standards, when designated separately from other rural categories, use green (red=151, green=203, blue=163)
 - For illustrating rural/frontier access standards use blue (red=45, green=155, blue=205)
 - For Kansas background and border states, use white.
- Consistent symbols:
 - Symbol for Single Provider Location: 10 pt open circle with no fill
 - Symbol for Multiple Provider Locations: 10 pt circle filled grey (red=176, green=176, blue=176)
- Use of landscape orientation for maps (portrait orientation for tables)
- Exclude landmarks, such as highways and water features
- Consistent scale, 40 miles per inch

Formatting Requirements- Summary Table

A summary table should be provided following each requested provider map. The summary table should include basic summary information and an “Access Standard Comparison Chart” showing strength of network for the provider type mapped. An example is provided as part of these instructions.

Formatting Requirements- County Tables

Sample tables illustrating the formatting requirements are included at the end of this document for your reference. The following clarifications are provided to ensure consistency across plans:

- For every provider type/specialty in the geo-access standard table below, the State would also like to see, by county, a breakdown of the percent of members with access to at least one provider within the standard. Percentages should be reported with one decimal place (rounded to tenth of a percent).

- Member access data should represent the distance, rounded to the nearest mile. (for the actual Geo reports, miles can be reported with one decimal place, but the summary table should be rounded to the nearest mile).
- Exclude provider counts by county.

Additional Report Formatting Requirements

Please provide a header on each page of the network adequacy report that includes:

- Report page numbers (by section is acceptable)
- MCO name
- Report date
- For each map please order the items as follows:
 - Map
 - Summary page
 - Detail table (urban/semi-urban)
 - Detail table (DSR/Rural/Frontier) NOTE: For BXH this will be two tables.

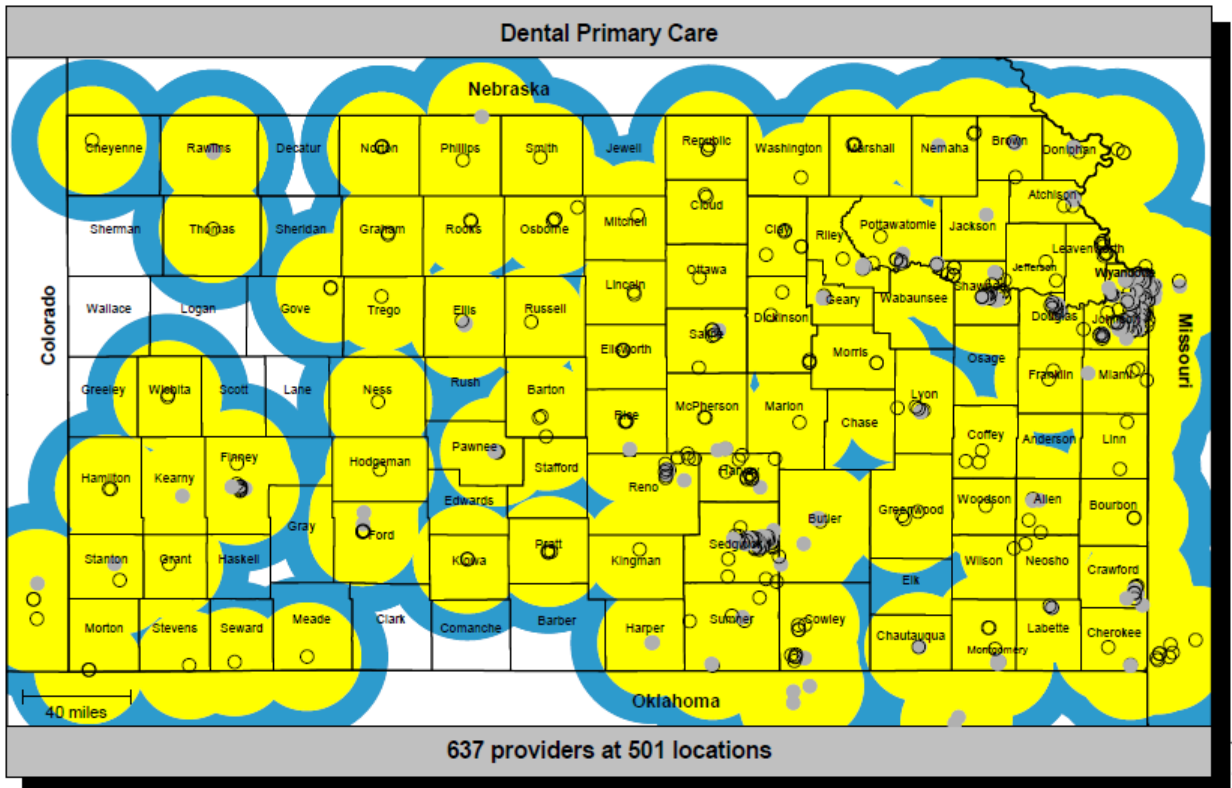

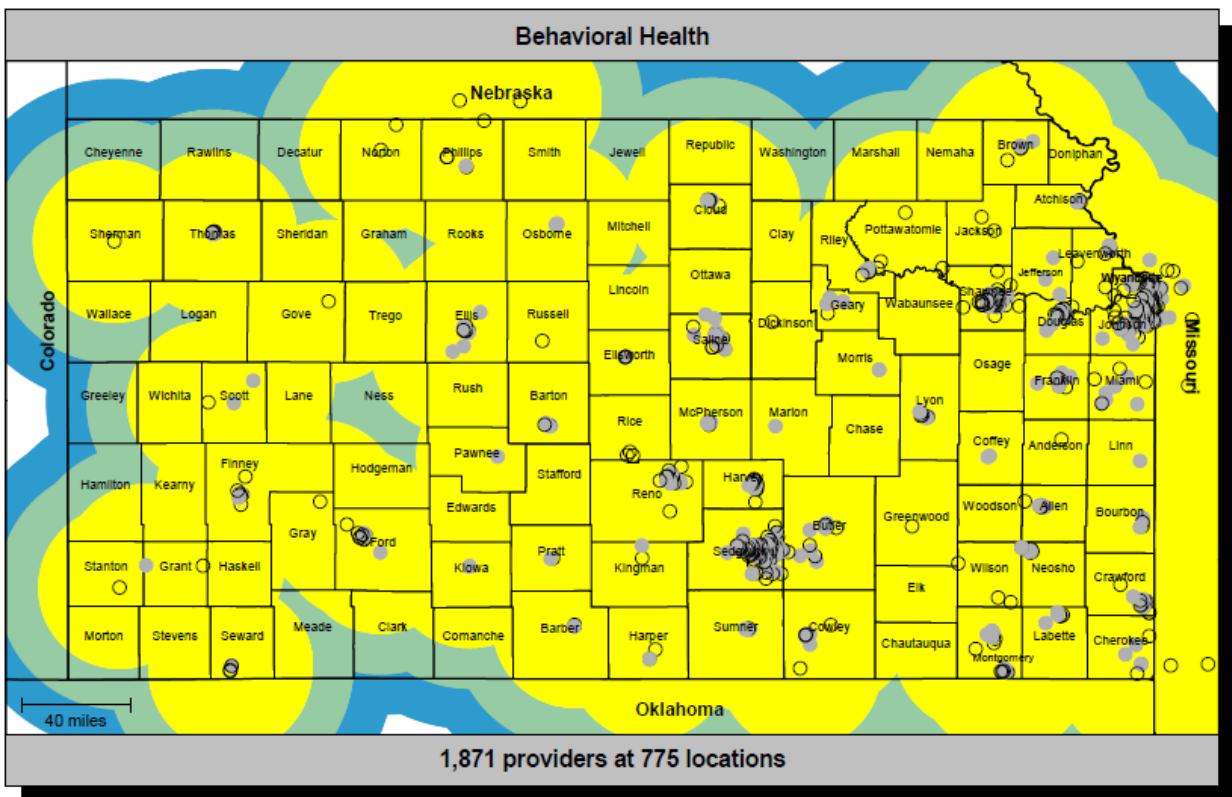


IDD Network
